

SEASONAL LESSON

Palm Sunday

Mark 11:1-11; Luke 19:28-40

When they drew near to Jerusalem and came to the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples. He said, "Go into the village in front of you. Immediately, you will find a colt tied. No one has ever sat on the colt. Untie it and bring it to Me. If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, 'The Lord needs it.' Then he will send it at once."

This took place to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet, saying,

"Say to the daughters of Zion, 'Behold, your king is coming to you, humble and mounted on a donkey, and on a colt, the foal of a beast of burden.'"

The disciples did as Jesus directed them. They found the colt tied at a door outside in the street, and they untied it. Some of those standing there said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?"


The disciples told them, "The Lord has need of it." The people let the disciples leave with the animal.

The disciples brought the colt to Jesus. They put their cloaks on the animal, and Jesus sat on it.

Most of the crowd spread their cloaks on the road. Others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. The crowds that went before Jesus and that followed Him were shouting, "Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!"

Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to Jesus, "Teacher, rebuke Your disciples."

Jesus answered, "I tell you, if these were silent, the very stones would cry out."



Family Faith Talk



SEASONAL LESSON

Easter

Mark 15:1-16:8

When Jesus lived on earth, He taught people about God and healed many who were sick. He did many miracles that showed He was God's Son. Jesus obeyed all of God's rules and never sinned. Jesus did that for us because we are sinners and He is the Savior God promised to send.


But there were some people who did not believe Jesus was the Savior. They wanted to hurt Him. They sent guards to capture Jesus. The guards tied Jesus' hands behind His back and took Him to a ruler named Pilate.

Pilate had Jesus beaten. But this was not enough for Jesus' enemies. So, even though Jesus had done nothing wrong, Pilate told his soldiers to nail Jesus to a cross. The nails hurt Jesus. But Jesus still loved the people who were hurting Him. He prayed, "Father, forgive them." After a few hours, the sky became very dark and the earth shook. Then Jesus said, "It is finished," and He died.

Jesus' friends wrapped Jesus in a clean cloth and put Him in a tomb—a cave in the side of a hill. Then they put a big rock in front of the opening so no one could go in or out. All this happened on the day we call Good Friday.

Early in the morning three days later, some women were walking to the tomb so they could put spices on Jesus' body. As they walked, they wondered, Who will move the stone away from the opening of the tomb? But when they got to the tomb, they had a big surprise! The big stone was already rolled away! Quickly, they hurried inside.

Surprise! Instead of Jesus' body, they saw an angel sitting inside Jesus' tomb. The angel told them, "Do not be alarmed. You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has risen; He is not here. See the place where they laid Him." Then the angel told the women to go tell Peter and the other disciples the happy news: Jesus is alive!

Take-Home Point

Family Faith Talk

He is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia! This week your child learned that Jesus suffered and died to pay for our sins and then came alive again on Easter. What happy news!

Plant seeds with your child to help your child think about the concept of death and new life. Talk about

how the seeds stay in the ground but then come to life as they grow into a plant. Tell your child, "Jesus died and was buried. Then He came to life again on Easter. He promises to make us alive again after we die and to give us life with Him forever."
